Dear Representative McMorris-Rodgers:

The undersigned members of the Consortium for Citizens with Disabilities (CCD) Employment and Training Task Force commend you for introducing the Transition to Independence Act, HR 5903. CCD is the largest coalition of national organizations working together to advocate for Federal public policy that ensures the self-determination, independence, empowerment, integration and inclusion of children and adults with disabilities in all aspects of society. The Employment and Training Task Force focuses on issues relevant to the employment of people with disabilities, particularly those programs and initiatives funded under the Rehabilitation Act and the employment and training programs administered by the Department of Labor. This task force collaborates with other CCD task forces concerning the Social Security Administration's efforts to facilitate the employment of individuals receiving Social Security benefits.

In its final report, the Advisory Committee (Advisory Committee) on Increasing Competitive, Integrated Employment for Individuals with Disabilities highlighted the low employment participation rate of persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities and those with other significant disabilities. Among the Advisory Committee's many recommendations for addressing this national crisis were several tailored toward identifying the most effective way to deliver services resulting in competitive, integrated employment outcomes. The Transition to Independence Act represents a significant step forward in promoting full integration of people with disabilities into the economic mainstream of this nation. By providing financial incentives to states to move individuals with significant disabilities out of segregated, subminimum wage settings into competitive, integrated employment opportunities, HR 5903 will foster skills building and career advancement for thousands of people with disabilities as well as providing the necessary data to expand successful practices nationwide.

Thank you for introducing this important legislation. We look forward to working with your office to ensure its passage.
