COVID-19 Materials for People with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities

Thank you for your support in promoting our [new suite of COVID-19 materials](#)—including posters, social stories, videos, and interactive activities—for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) who have extreme low literacy (ELL)! We are excited to introduce these materials with the aim of giving people with IDD and ELL and their caregivers the information they need to help them stay safe from COVID-19. These materials cover five behaviors that are important to prevent COVID-19: getting vaccinated, getting a COVID-19 test, handwashing, wearing a mask, and keeping a safe distance until fully vaccinated.

Why get involved?

People with IDD have a higher incidence of COVID-19 than people without IDD. They are also more likely to be admitted to the hospital from COVID-19 complications, have higher rates of stays in intensive care units, and are more likely to die from COVID-19. Yet people with IDD often do not have the information they need to protect themselves. To fill this gap, CDC created materials about COVID-19 and emergency preparedness that are specifically designed to meet this population's needs.

Who should use this promotion kit?

This kit is for disability service and advocacy groups, health care and public health organizations, and anyone else who is committed to improving communication and messaging about COVID-19 for people with IDD and ELL, their caregivers, and the organizations that support them.
